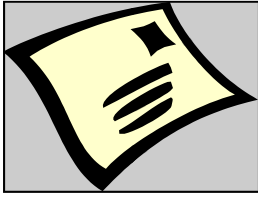

Letter from DVCC Executive Director



The Domestic Violence Coordinating Council of Greater Omaha (DVCC) has aggressively pursued a coordinated community response to domestic violence since 1996. The DVCC is fortunate to operate in such a charitable, hardworking and involved environment. Omaha and Douglas County support the mission and the goals and objectives of the Council.

In 2002, the DVCC was able to partner with more state and local organizations, agencies, businesses, and nonprofits than

ever before to ensure greater safety for domestic violence victims and increased accountability for their offenders.

The four officers of the DVCC Executive Board, led by Donald Carey (Omaha Police Chief), worked diligently to ensure the DVCC mission was both the foundation and at the center of all committee work and office activities. The 2003-2005 Strategic Plan was adopted and implementation began immediately.

The committees of the DVCC made significant contributions to both local and state domestic violence initiatives. The Legislative Committee neared completion of a uniform domestic violence code for the state of Nebraska; the Medical Committee developed the nation's first domestic violence medical school

elective curriculum; the Public Awareness Committee plastered domestic violence awareness information and hotline numbers across city buses; and the Court Watch Committee released the first Court Watch publication in Nebraska.

2002 marked my fourth year as DVCC Executive Director and fifth with the Council. I feel more privileged than ever to be working with and for the various Council and Committee members. Individually and collectively, this group of people is making a tremendous difference in the lives of domestic violence victims and their children.

I look forward to a productive and rewarding 2003.

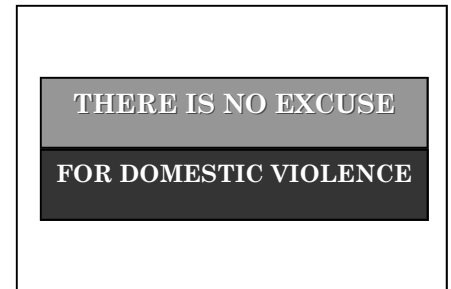

- Facilitate the cooperation and coordination between agencies, departments and the court system dealing with domestic violence;
- Promote effective prevention, intervention and treatment techniques for those with working with DV victims and offenders; and
- Raise awareness and improve the community's response to domestic violence.



TAKE ACTION!

- ◆ DVCC Court Watch Program entered district and county courtrooms in March, 2002.
- ◆ DVCC collaborated with area DV victim advocates and NE Humane Society workers to develop animal abuse, child abuse, and intimate partner abuse cross trainings.
- ◆ Over 2,000 DV medical physician guides, 1,500 DV medical tent cards, and 4,000 multicultural healthcare DV resource posters were disseminated to area physicians and facilities.
- ◆ DVCC launched its informational website and linked coordinated community response partners.
- ◆ DVCC Domestic Violence Healthcare Program and its 163 medical volunteers have provided DV training and education to 20,764 healthcare providers to date.
- ◆ With federal funding, the DVCC was able to send 16 individuals to domestic violence training conferences around the country. The individuals represented the following

Accomplishments of the DVCC

- agencies: Omaha Police Department, YWCA, NE State Probation, UNO Criminal Justice, Douglas County Attorney's Office, Methodist Hospital, and US Attorney's Office.
- ◆ DVCC and NE Probation Department certified five (5) area Batterer Intervention Program/Providers and distributed "BIP Bench Guides" to all District, County, and Juvenile Court judges and bailiffs.
- ◆ DV awareness and educational conferences were provided to area faith providers, fire fighters, city/county, and mental health workers at no cost.
- ◆ DVCC Court Watch Program conducted three full-day training sessions, generating 65 active volunteer monitors.
- ◆ DVCC Court Watch Program Monitors logged a monthly average of 180 courtroom hours.
- ◆ DVCC and the Omaha Fire Department partnered to equip all 23 Omaha fire stations with emergency telephones and

transform all stations into "Safe Havens" for victims of domestic violence.

- ◆ DVCC Medical Committee and DV Healthcare Program developed a domestic violence medical school elective curriculum available to University of Nebraska Medical Center fourth year medical students.
- ◆ The Yellow Dress/Remote Control in collaboration with the DVCC, Great Plains Girl Scout Council, National Council of Jewish Women, and the YWCA performed 141 violence prevention programs reaching over 24,000 area students K-12.
- ◆ DVCC hosted its Fifth Annual "Work to End Domestic Violence Day" breakfast conference for over 180 area employers representing 54 different local businesses.
- ◆ DVCC Court Watch Program published first Quarterly Report in February, 2003.

DVCC Court Watch Program

The DVCC Court Watch program had a successful first year with numerous accomplishments. The program held its first monitor volunteer training in February, 2002 and entered the courtrooms on March 4, 2002.

Since February, quarterly monitor training sessions have been held. A total of 65 monitors have been trained by domestic violence and criminal justice experts to monitor domestic violence proceedings in County and District courts. Each monitor must undergo and pass criminal and reference checks, verify that they do not have pending cases in Douglas County courts, and complete an eight hour training.

Douglas County attorneys, NE State Probation officers, officers from the Omaha Police Department, and advocates from the YWCA provide essential components to the full day monitor training. The monitors

are men and women between the ages of 19 and 62, of various ethnic backgrounds, educational levels and occupations.

In 2002, DVCC monitors observed a monthly average of 180 domestic violence proceedings in district and county courts. Monitors devoted a monthly average of 62 observation hours inside the courtrooms. The monitors record important information on attitudes and activities that occur inside the courtroom that statistics or court records cannot capture.

The DVCC Court Watch program has an active and involved Advisory Committee, chaired by Dianne Seeman Lozier, is comprised of 15 legal, criminal justice system and advocate experts. Through the work of the Advisory Committee, important criminal justice data and access to court calendars is available to the DVCC. The DVCC Court Watch program published its

first quarterly report in February, 2003.

The Court Watch report includes statistics and information provided by all partners in this community's coordinated response. Court Watch reports will be published quarterly and will highlight court bond amounts, sentences, batterer intervention program findings, and more.

DVCC Domestic Violence Healthcare Program

Over 20,500 area Healthcare Providers have received Specialized Domestic Violence Education and Training

The DVCC Healthcare Program completed its fourth year of providing specialized domestic violence education and training to healthcare providers within the City, County, and across the state of Nebraska. As an integral part of the coordinated community response, the DVCC Healthcare Program developed several pilot projects and conducted two re-

search efforts that expanded and enhanced the overall healthcare response to domestic violence.

In 2002, the program conducted two medical train-the-trainer course offerings, bringing the total number of DV medical trainers to 163. Trainers come from the area's five major healthcare systems (Alegent, Children's, Creighton, Methodist, NHS) along with Douglas County Department of Health, Offutt Air Force Base, numerous free-standing clinics, and individual practitioners.

Together with the Program Director, the medical trainers provided training to over 5,400 health care workers in 2002. To date, the Program has provided specialized

domestic violence education and training to 20,767 health care providers.

Michael Levine, MD, has chaired the DVCC Medical Committee since 2000 and continues to provide guidance and leadership to the medical committee and trainers. Committee work product and involvement extends to local, state and national initiatives.

The Medical Committee and trainers incorporated multicultural sensitivity, strangulation, and local research outcomes to the education and training curriculums. In 2002, the Program developed a domestic violence elective curriculum for fourth year medical students that will be implemented area medical universities as early as Spring 2003.

The DVCC is a 501(c)(3) non-profit that operates its office and community programs from the generous contributions of local and state individuals and funding sources.

The DVCC writes grants and receives federal funding for several member organizations of the DVCC in Omaha and Douglas County.

The DVCC works in conjunction with the City of Omaha, Douglas County, and Omaha Community Foundation grant writers to ensure coordination of fiscal resources, reduction of duplicative services, and coverage of identified community needs and services.
